



Criteria/Guidelines For Award Categories

SECONDARY SCHOOL

Administrator of the Year

- Leads an effective structure for netball within the school
- Organizes and oversees the annual netball programme
- Spends time ensuring the structure works through communication and support
- Attends relevant meetings to represent the school
- Looks for opportunities for players, coaches and umpires
- Takes time to support, coach, umpire, and or recruit people to be involved or carries out any other activities in support of the game
- Has developed a plan to benefit netball in the school

Coach of the Year

- Works closely with one team or several teams
- Has prepared a successful secondary school side through a well organized seasons programme
- Creates a positive training and playing environment
- Has displayed a willingness to attend coaching courses, seminars and or programmes
- Provides excellent programmes for the development of individual players
- Has a sense of Fair Play

Junior Team Coach of the Year

- Works closely with one or several junior or developmental teams i.e. Under 15
- Has prepared a successful junior secondary school team through a well organized season programme
- Creates a positive training and development environment
- Has displayed a willingness to attend coaching courses, seminars and programmes
- Provides excellent programmes for individual player development
- Has a sense of Fair Play

Student Coach of the Year

- Bona fide Secondary School Student
- Coached a Secondary, Intermediate or Primary team or teams throughout the season
- Has prepared a well organized seasons programme
- Created a positive training and playing environment
- Has displayed a willingness to attend coaching courses/seminars, and/or programmes
- Has a sense of Fair Play

School of the Year

- Have coaching, leadership, umpiring, netball programmes going within the school
- Provide netball opportunities for all who want to play
- Have a strong support structure for coaches, umpires and players
- Have shown some initiative or been innovative

- Have worked to increase team numbers or attract more umpires or coaches or get students contributing to the life of the netball in the School, the Centre or the Region
- Has a plan for the development of netball in the school

Team of the Year

- The team that has won or competed at the highest possible level within the Centre, the Region and/or New Zealand
- Has competed in Baywide initiatives and has encouraged individuals to put themselves forward for selection for the Bay of Plenty Representative Teams
- Played as a team, supporting and encouraging each other throughout the season
- Displayed sportsmanship and a sense of Fair Play
- Participation in the life of the School and the Centre i.e.: provided umpires, coaches, helpers and supporters

Umpire of the Year

- A secondary school umpire who has achieved the highest possible umpire qualification
- Has been recognised by the Region and/or NNZ as an up and coming umpire
- Has umpired for the School and the Region and/or umpires on a regular basis at Netball Centre level
- A member of an umpire development squad / mentoring programme
- Encourages others to umpire

Netballer of the Year

- An outstanding player who has been recognized at the Regional or National level
- A player who has made a contribution to Netball at the School, Netball Centre and/or Regional level
- Has a keen desire to succeed and win
- Displays outstanding sportsmanship
